The teachers, staff and students have been working hard with curriculum, reviewing old concepts, taking benchmark assessments and getting ready for standardized testing in April for grades 3-5. Never a dull moment at Ruskin.

One of the things that we have done as a district to support students who may be having challenges in literacy is to hire a reading tutor at each elementary site. I am **proud to introduce Ms. Peggy Nguyen as Ruskin's new reading tutor.** Ms. Peggy is a longtime employee, working as a Ruskin Noon Duty Supervisor and working with students after school in the Right At School program. We are so happy to have her in this capacity! All reading tutors will be getting formally trained and will be pulling students in small group; based on assessments and teacher recommendation. Our starting focus groups will be newcomers to the country and 1st and 2nd grade students that need that extra support. Welcome Ms. Peggy!

Parents, please be mindful of your children at pick up and dismissal times. We have had students running around the gates, hopping on slippery pipes and engaging in unsafe

- Once you receive 3 unexcused absences or a combination of a "late" tardy (31 minutes or more late) and unexcused absences (3 total), you will receive a truancy notice.
- An additional truancy will require a meeting with the Principal, Social Worker
- Continued truancy may result in a meeting with the district attendance team

Independent Study Process

Do you need to take a few days off in the middle of the school year? Need to visit a sick family member or go on a family getaway? Did you know that if your child has overall good attendance, you may be eligible to take what's called an Independent Study, which would excuse their absences for a 5-9 day period? It is an **official contract** between the Principal, Teacher, Parent and Student, stating that the parent is acting as the "teacher" for the duration of the contract and will ensure that all work is completed to get credit for the absences. To apply for an Independent Study, here are the steps:

- Apply in the office at least two weeks in advance
- The attendance clerk will check the form
- The Principal then approves or denies the request
- Once approved, the teacher then has 2 weeks to get all of the classwork together
- The work is due upon the end date of the contract (if work is not turned in that day, the contract is null and void and the absences will then be unexcused)
- Only ONE Independent Study contract is allowed per year

School Nutrition Services is hiring Food service substitutes to help out in the kitchen. If you are interested, please log onto <u>edjoin.org</u> and look under Berryessa Union School District. School meals will continue to be FREE for ALL students thanks to California's Universal Meals program. Each student may receive 1 free breakfast and 1 free lunch each school day. Meals include fruit, vegetables, and milk. Milk taken separately from a meal costs \$0.50 (covered by Universal Meals program if taken with a school meal).
