You may have heard about the unfortunate incident that happened at an Atlanta school this week. It hurts my heart to hear incidents such as these. On Thursday, the staff had our first emergency training provided by ICS4Schools. It is a company that does all of the emergency training for each school in our district. We learn the logistics on what to do in case of a school emergency, of various sorts. The company is made up of retired



emergency personnel that provide unique support for Ruskin's Emergency Preparedness Plan. In the event of an emergency, please know that you will need to have an ID in order for us to release a student to you or anyone on their Student Verification Form. It is CRUCIAL that you have completed the Student Verification Form that you received in the mail before school started. BY LAW WE WILL NOT RELEASE THE STUDENTS TO ANYONE THAT IS NOT ON THAT FORM. Our release area will be situated in front of the school on Turlock Ln. I will continue to share more Parent information regarding our Emergency Preparedness Plan.

Social Emotional/ PBIS Corner

While we are teaching students to **Be Safe**, **Respectful and Be Responsible**, we are

also doing what we can to take care of their socio emotional well being. In order to have emotionally healthy children, we need for their parents to be healthy emotionally as well. Have you ever been on an airplane? If so, you have heard the flight attendant to direct you to put on your oxygen mask FIRST before assisting your child. In order to take care of your child, you must first take care of yourself. Here are some tips to help with stress management:

- 1. Creating a Joy Jar
- Action Step: Keep a "Joy Jar" in your workspace or at home. Whenever something positive happens, write it down and place it in the jar. Review these notes whenever you need a pick-me-up.
- Why It Helps: A Joy Jar serves as a tangible reminder of good moments, helping to boost morale and provide comfort during tough times.
- 2. Simplified Meal Planning
- Action Step: Plan simple, healthy meals for the week ahead. Use meal prep techniques like batch cooking or preparing ingredients in advance to save time during busy weekdays.
- Why It Helps: Having meals prepared reduces daily decision-making stress and ensures you and your family eat nutritious foods, supporting overall health and energy levels.

This week's featured school is California State University Fullerton or (CSUF), located in Fullerton, CA. It was founded in 1957 and classes began in 1959. It has around 41,000 students, making it the largest CSU student body. Some more facts are:

- It's Mascot is an elephant names Tuffy Titan
- The school's newspaper is the Daily Titan
- It offers 163 degrees, 54 undergrad degrees and 49 graduate degrees
- They were ranked in the Top 10 public schools in 2011
- They are a Hispanic serving university and designated to becoming an Asian American Native Pacific Islander university (this means they enroll a specific percentage of students from certain minority groups)
- They are a Division 1 NCAA school
- Most popular degrees are teaching, engineering, economics and nursing

Attendance, Tardies and Truancies

As you may know, there is a significant connection between consistent student attendance and student success. Research shows that students who attend school regularly are more likely to achieve proficiency in core subjects like math and reading. Students with better attendance are more likely to graduate on time compared to their counterparts with lower attendance rates. Please assist us in getting the kids to school on time. Some helpful tips are as follows:



- Pick out clothing the night before
- Put backpacks, lunch, water bottles, instruments, etc by the door
- Set your alarms for 10 minutes earlier
- Make it a fun game. "Can we get there 5 minutes early? 10 minutes early?"


For the ensured safety of everyone, please remember the following:




After School Care


