Happy Friday Ruskin Families,



Did you know that today is the first day of National Hispanic Heritage Month? "Each year, Americans observe National Hispanic Heritage Month from September 15 to October 15, by celebrating the histories, cultures and contributions of American citizens whose ancestors came from Spain, Mexico, the Caribbean and Central and South America. The observation started in 1968 as Hispanic Heritage Week under President Lyndon Johnson and was expanded by President Ronald Reagan in 1988 to cover a 30-day period starting on September 15 and ending on October 15. It was enacted into law on August 17, 1988. The day of September 15 is significant because it is the anniversary of independence for Latin American countries Costa Rica, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras and Nicaragua. In addition, Mexico and Chile celebrate their independence days on September 16 and September 18, respectively. Also, Columbus Day or Día de la Raza, which is October 12, falls within this 30 day period." Field Closed for Next Two Months

I would like to make you aware that starting Monday 9/18/23, the district will be re-doing Ruskin's turf and field. The first step is to bring in temporary fencing to prevent access to the field. This temporary fencing will be delivered and installed Monday after 2:30. Next, the contractor will be bringing out the necessary equipment to start preparing the field, including a tractor. During the rehab process they will be using a lot of water to germinate the new seed, which cannot be avoided. All contracted employees who work

on this project will check in with the office prior to starting any work daily. During this time, there will be no access to the turf for the next two months. We will also be keeping all exterior gates that lead to the field locked during this time. We will be installing signage around the perimeter of the field letting the community know of the field closure. We apologize for any inconvenience this may cause, but we look forward to how beautiful our grass and field will be, once the project is completed.


