many African Americans were under when inventing these items. Some of them had been born into slavery and had that hardship to overcome. The laws were against them and it was an uphill battle to patent their creations. Did you know that **the first open heart surgery was performed by a Black surgeon by the name of Daniel Hale Williams** in 1893? Did you know that a MIssouri farmer, born into slavery, named **George Washington Carver, grew up to create over 300 products derived from peanuts.** Some of them are butter, cocoa, milk, animal feed, shampoo, soap, shaving cream and instant coffee to name a few. Did you know that **Benjamin Banneker, a black man, was responsible for completing the plans to build the White House and the city of Washington, DC?** These are but a few of the many contributions of African Americans that we benefit from today. On Wednesday, we celebrated the 100th Day of School. The students created all sorts of projects and did 100th Day activities. Here are some pictures of the kids' work.






















Updated Message from the Yearbook Committee Final Due Date is Sunday, February 4th

- Once you receive 3 unexcused absences or a combination of a "late" tardy (31 minutes or more late) and unexcused absences (3 total), you will receive a truancy notice.
- An additional truancy will require a meeting with the Principal, Social Worker
- Continued truancy may result in a meeting with the district attendance team

Independent Study Process

Do you need to take a few days off in the middle of the school year? Need to visit a sick family member or go on a family getaway? Did you know that if your child has overall good attendance, you may be eligible to take what's called an Independent Study, which would excuse their absences for a 5-9 day period? It is an **official contract** between the Principal, Teacher, Parent and Student, stating that the parent is acting as the "teacher" for the duration of the contract and will ensure that all work is completed to get credit for the absences. To apply for an Independent Study, here are the steps:

- Apply in the office at least two weeks in advance
- The attendance clerk will check the form
- The Principal then approves or denies the request
- Once approved, the teacher then has 2 weeks to get all of the classwork together
- The work is due upon the end date of the contract (if work is not turned in that day, the contract is null and void and the absences will then be unexcused)
- Only ONE Independent Study contract is allowed per year

School Nutrition Services is hiring Food service substitutes to help out in the kitchen. If you are interested, please log onto <u>edjoin.org</u> and look under Berryessa Union School District. School meals will continue to be FREE for ALL students thanks to California's Universal Meals program. Each student may receive 1 free breakfast and 1 free lunch each school day. Meals include fruit, vegetables, and milk. Milk taken separately from a meal costs \$0.50 (covered by Universal Meals program if taken with a school meal).
