TK- 2 teachers researched the answer and shared the info with the students. Then they entered their answer into a drawing for their grade level span. Students in 3rd-5th grade researched the answers themselves and entered their answers into the drawing for their grade level span winners won the teacher 30 minutes of prep time and the class won 30 minutes of fun time. Congrats! The next trivia question will be asked on next Monday, 2/26, at flagpole.

I have continued to read to the students. The two books are <u>Eyes That Kiss in the</u> <u>Corners</u> and <u>Ron's Big Mission</u>, one celebrating the beauty, culture and history a daughter of Chinese descent sees in her mother's and grandmother's eyes. The other book is about Challenger astronaut Ron McNair and how he stood up and demanded a change to the unfair laws in his South Carolina town. #### Respect

#### **Respect and Mental Wellness**

Children with good mental wellness feel loved, safe and secure in their environments. They also feel happy and positive about themselves most of the time. The sense of feeling cared for and accepted by family and peers can further positivity. Children who respect others are better able to find positive ways to problem solve and manage conflict. They understand there are different points of view and accept these differences.

#### Ways to help children foster respect at home

Teach children that no matter what a person's differences are, they have something special to bring to the community. It is important we respect people, even when they are different:.

- Set appropriate boundaries
- Involve children in decision making
- Teach children to ask for things, not demand
- Model respect toward others
- Teach empathy
- Teach and model respectful communication



## **College Monday**

This week's featured college is Florida A&M. Florida A&M University is a public institution that was founded in 1887. It has a total undergraduate enrollment of 7,709 (fall 2022), its setting is urban, and the campus size is 422 acres. It utilizes a semester-based academic calendar. Florida A&M University's ranking in the 2024 edition of Best Colleges is National Universities, #170. Its in-state tuition and fees are \$5,785; out-of-state tuition and fees are \$17,725.

Florida A&M University, located in the hills of Tallahassee, is the only historically black institution in the State University System of Florida. The school's mission is to educate African-Americans, but it accepts students of every race, ethnic origin and nationality. Although the "A&M" in its name stands for Agricultural and Mechanical, the university offers about 60 bachelor's degrees in a wide range of studies, with architecture, journalism and psychology among the most popular undergraduate majors. Graduate students at Florida A&M can choose from about 40 degrees, including law and education.

The university, more commonly known as FAMU, also offers more than 100 student organizations and several fraternities and sororities to join. Student athletes can try out for the FAMU Rattlers varsity sports teams, which compete in the NCAA Division I Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference. Notable FAMU alumni include Fox Sports reporter Pam Oliver and Vibe magazine co-founder Keith Clinkscales. (Florida A&M site)

- Once you receive 3 unexcused absences or a combination of a "late" tardy (31 minutes or more late) and unexcused absences (3 total), you will receive a truancy notice.
- An additional truancy will require a meeting with the Principal, Social Worker
- Continued truancy may result in a meeting with the district attendance team

## **Independent Study Process**

Do you need to take a few days off in the middle of the school year? Need to visit a sick family member or go on a family getaway? Did you know that if your child has overall good attendance, you may be eligible to take what's called an Independent Study, which would excuse their absences for a 5-9 day period? It is an **official contract** between the Principal, Teacher, Parent and Student, stating that the parent is acting as the "teacher" for the duration of the contract and will ensure that all work is completed to get credit for the absences. To apply for an Independent Study, here are the steps:

- Apply in the office at least two weeks in advance
- The attendance clerk will check the form
- The Principal then approves or denies the request
- Once approved, the teacher then has 2 weeks to get all of the classwork together
- The work is due upon the end date of the contract (if work is not turned in that day, the contract is null and void and the absences will then be unexcused)
- Only ONE Independent Study contract is allowed per year

Meals include fruit, vegetables, and milk. Milk taken separately from a meal costs \$0.50 (covered by Universal Meals program if taken with a school meal).
