How was your week? There was a lot going on at Ruskin! The students in 3rd-5th grades have been taking the

CAASPP standardized exams exhibiting what they have learned throughout the school year. Here is the link again with parent resources for testing <u>CAASPP</u> <u>Parent/Guardian Resources</u>. On Thursday, staff was trained on how to safely release students to their parent, guardian or approved pick up person in the event of an emergency. We will be having a drill this coming Monday to practice with the students **so there will BE NO FLAG POLE ON MONDAY, APRIL 29TH**.

You may have noticed that cones are out, then they are not out...We are working with SJPD, City of San Jose, the head of our Maintenance Department and Superintendent Fuentes to make sure that traffic is kept as safe as possible in the area while also being considerate of our neighbors. With that being said, what would **REALLY** help us out would be if drivers actually followed the safety and traffic rules and guidelines. **There are no left turns out of the horseshoe.** Signs are posted yet people do so and cause traffic jams and near misses with

oncoming traffic. That is the **ONLY** reason that cones are present. We appreciate you keeping our students, staff and community safe by abiding by the rules. **That includes no U- turns in the middle of the street during pick up / drop off.** Thanks for helping us out and thank you for the kind emails appreciating what we are doing to keep everyone safe. 



Social Emotional Learning

As part of our **PBIS (Positive Behavior Interventions and Support) Initiative**, staff members are trained to explicitly teach children the positive expected behaviors they wish to see. One of the things we teach children is to be kind. What does that actually mean? It may be easier to show by example. Here are 10 ways in which children can be kind to others at school:

Kindness at school

- 1. Hold the door open for your teacher or headteacher.
- 2. Let someone else go in front of the line to go out to play.
- 3. Help a friend who's stuck on their classwork.
- 4. Clear up a mess you didn't make.
- 5. Tell someone a joke to cheer them up if they're feeling sad.
- 6. Hang up someone's coat if it's fallen off its peg.
- 7. Sharpen all the pencils in the class at breaktime.
- 8. Sort out the reading books if they're all jumbled up.
- 9. Write your teacher a note or a poem about why you like them.
- 10. Clear out your old books and donate them to the school library.

Traffic Reminders




Parents, please remember, NOT to park in the horseshoe. It is made for cars to move in and out of quickly. As always, if you would like to volunteer to help out with traffic safety, please contact the front office at 408-923-1950 or email me at <u>Lblackshire@busd.net</u>.

For the ensured safety of everyone, please remember the following:

- Please do not park in the bus zone
- Please use the crosswalk near the staff parking lot
- Pull ALL the way forward in the horseshoe



- Please do not park in the STAFF parking lot
- Thank you for not parking in front of or in the neighbor's driveway
- Please do not double park OR park in the horseshoe
- Try to come early or walk or bike to school if possible
- Staff supervision of students begins at 7:50
- Please leave the premises once the bell rings so we may lock down the school
- Please do not let your children out in the middle of the street or the parking lot

Attendance Matters

- Once you receive 3 unexcused absences or a combination of a "late" tardy (31 minutes or more late) and unexcused absences (3 total), you will receive a truancy notice.
- An additional truancy will require a meeting with the Principal, Social Worker
- Continued truancy may result in a meeting with the district attendance team

Independent Study Process

Do you need to take a few days off in the middle of the school year? Need to visit a sick family member or go on a family getaway? Did you know that if your child has overall good attendance, you may be eligible to take what's called an Independent Study, which would excuse their absences for a 5-9 day period? It is an **official contract** between the Principal, Teacher, Parent and Student, stating that the parent is acting as the "teacher" for the duration of the contract and will ensure that all work is completed to get credit for the absences. To apply for an Independent Study, here are the steps:

- Apply in the office at least two weeks in advance
- The attendance clerk will check the form
- The Principal then approves or denies the request
- Once approved, the teacher then has 2 weeks to get all of the classwork together

- The work is due upon the end date of the contract (if work is not turned in that day, the contract is null and void and the absences will then be unexcused)
- Only ONE Independent Study contract is allowed per year
- Not allowed during standardized testing for grades 3-5
- Not allowed last 2 weeks of school
